BUILDING COMMITTEE UPDATE

We had a delay with the water supply for the fire suppression system which caused a gridlock to the rest of the project. Thankfully, all coding and regulatory issues have been sorted out and complied with and things are now back on track. This past week, the fire and domestic water line installation process was begun. This will allow other parts of the project to continue. More curbing was staked out this week in anticipation of being poured next week. We expect the rocking and paving of the three large parking areas to be imminent. Once the water line is inspected and pressure tested, Caldwell will be onsite to start pouring the footings late next week.

ABOUT WHITE OAK ARP




